ASB/Crime/Criminal Damage

Report received of bike being driven recklessly over at rear of Stemp Drive. Advised resident reference reporting to the police as this was not done at the time. Patrols increased in the vicinity.

Male arrested twice in the village after information given to police from Wardens for breach of Community Protection Notice.

Report of drugs being offered to young people at Skate ramp on Jubilee fields. Resident advised on reporting to the police every occurrence. Patrols increased in this area and children young and old spoken to to advise, to obtain further information and to explain the consequences of this behaviour. Information given to local PCSOs.

Reports of young person's littering and climbing around stairwells in Jengers Mead, advice given to persons affected and patrols in the area made. Police advised and request to make area a hotspot. Reports obtained of same group displaying anti-social behaviour in local library. Children found; names taken with verbal warnings given. Children also signposted to Wardens free summer sports sessions where a number attended.

Report of fire in progress in Daux Wood, fire brigade met in vicinity and local knowledge used to show location of fire to be put out.

Resident reported a neighbour for excessive noise, drug use and excessive alcohol use over an extended period of time. They also reported people coming and going and doors slamming at anti-social hours. Advice was given reference further occurrences and reporting to the police as well as the local housing provider. We also contacted the housing provider and raised a safeguarding alert due to other issues raised we shared concerns about.

Advice given to High Street business regarding anti-social behaviour after pub closing time and Warden contact details passed on.

Words of advice given to adult male after complaints received from local shop regarding alleged anti-social behaviour.

Parking/Vehicles

Report of ASB with a vehicle driving around Jubilee Fields Pond. Informant confirmed report made to police. Details of vehicle taken and kept for future reference.

Leisure Centre ongoing situation with cars parked on service road, patrols in this area in conjunction with the police. Liaising with the local Leisure Centre staff to discuss plan moving forward.

Report of vehicle parked in Jubilee Fields car park with drug litter nearby. On arrival vehicle had left but member of the public had helpfully taken note of vehicle index and details. These were recorded and drug litter removed.

Reports of drug use some evenings in Jubilee Fields from cars parked in the car park, patrols increased at reported times. Patrols requested by local police and PCSOs at this time also.

Large fallen tree branch cleared from main road into Billingshurst that was causing an obstruction to traffic.

Directed traffic after a car crash on the High Street until vehicles and debris were removed from the road.

Fly tipping/Littering/Graffiti

Parish wide fly tipping patrols carried out and fly tipping reports carried out for Lordings Road and Adversane Lane. Warden litter picks carried out in Station Road Gardens, Rowner Road and Wooddale Road.

Community Engagement/Events/Meetings

1 drop in at Billingshurst Library, 4 drop ins at Billingshurst Community Centre. Meeting with Partnership Officer at West Sussex County Council and a Street Pastors meeting.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

Weekly fly tipping patrols, Hi Vis foot and vehicle patrols each shift. Increased patrols in areas highlighted by local community reports.

Patrol with Partnership officer to discuss areas for partnership officer volunteers to help improve the village.

Elderly/Vulnerable and Youth

Held 6 football sessions throughout the summer in conjunction with Brighton and Hove Albion and Horsham Sports Development Team. These were free and paid for by Wardens with money obtained by a successful funding application.

Ran 6 free summer sports sessions in conjunction with HDC sports development team.

Support and signposting given to vulnerable adult regarding addiction, welfare checks also carried out.
