<u>ASB</u>

There has been a report regarding some anti-social behaviour at the junction of Luxford Way and Stane Street, whereby 3 - 4 young males are putting plastic chairs in the road causing car drivers to swerve to either miss the chair or stop to have to move it. This is happening between 10.30pm to 11.30pm. The

informant has been advised to call the police at the time it is happening if possible as this type of incident could cause a nasty accident.

We received another report of a young male who was seen lying in the road just past the Hilland Road Roundabout, then jumping up. The informant was told to ring the police on 999 in future as the traffic can be quite fast coming off the roundabout. This incident could have resulted in a fatality if the young person tripped trying to get up or could have caused someone to swerve which could have caused injury to the person driving or any passengers.

There have been reports regarding young people jumping into the road in Station Road and hitting cars with bits of foam tubing possibly insulation tubing. See picture below.



Parking/Vehicles

Five vehicles have been reported to Operation Crackdown for parking illegally in the High Street.

One vehicle has been reported to DVLA for no tax.

A resident made us aware of the theft of their number plates twice in two weeks. The vehicle was parked in the Six Bells Car Park and the number plates had been stolen during daylight hours. This has been reported to the police and DVLA. We will patrol the carpark as often as we can and keep an eye out for any suspicious behaviour.

Fly Tipping/Littering/Graffiti

Drug litter (empty cannabis bags) has been found in Station Road Community Gardens, Challen Street Play Area, Newman Way Play Area, Manor Fields, Jubilee Fields and Daux Wood.

Community Engagement/Events/Meetings

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

We go out on foot patrols daily so that the residents can stop and speak to us about any issues that they are having or just to have a chat. We also visit businesses, shops, the school, the railway station, etc. to check if there is anything they wish to discuss with us.

Lunchtime patrols continue in the Weald School and it has been a really good way of meeting the students and getting to know them and for them to get to know us - particularly the Year 7 students who we have been focussing on this term.

We have been patrolling the areas where breaks to cars and theft of car registration plates have occurred, some of which have occurred during the day. If you live in the areas of Coombe Hill, Carpenters, Station Road, Arun Road and Brookers Road could you please review your CCTV/Ring doorbell footage to check if anything was caught on it and if so, please inform the police.

Older, vulnerable people and Youth

We have continued our visits to check on those residents with Careline alarms, to check on their welfare and to see if there is anything else that we can help with.

Julie and Vanessa Green who is Head of Davinci House, were invited to talk about our new joint project to parents who were waiting for a talk by West Sussex Mind called "Understanding Young Peoples' Mental Health".

We were able to let the parents know about the Parent Support Sessions we will be holding in the New Year; several of the parents appeared very interested, so we look forward to meeting them in the New Year.

Dog related issues.

It has been reported to us that a dog was aggressive and not under control by the owner. We signposted the informant to the police who deal with incidents such as these.

It's essential that all dogs have a strong and reliable recall before being let off the lead in a public place. A strong recall means that you will be able to get their lead back on with ease and, if necessary, take control

of a situation and remove them before a situation becomes dangerous. There are many dog training groups in the area so, if you need help, please give one of them a call.
