If anyone has any board games at home that they no longer play, we are more than happy to accept donations.




Family Fun Day – Jubilee Fields – Saturday 9th August

- Meet the needs of the community and improve the quality of life for the residents, through engagement, promotion and support.
- · Develop projects that benefit the local residents, to tackle community safety issues and promote inclusivity.
- Promote community cohesion resilience and solidarity to encourage and empower communities to resolve issues

- Support vulnerable members of the community with activities, advice, welfare checks and signposting.
- . Engage with residents daily to get to know their local community and become a trusted friend to offer advice and guidance
- Offer education and advice when required, before taking enforcement
- Contribute to the delivery of the Community Safety Partnership plan by working with other agencie
- Provide a highly visible and reassuring uniformed patrolling presence.
- · Provide an effective eyes and ears service aimed at reducing the fear of crime and improving quality
- · Work alongside the Police and submit reports regarding drug use, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour.
