

BILLINGSHURST PARISH WARDENS' REPORT February 2019

ASB / Criminal damage

- Responded to call from the Weald to investigate suspicious car parking near school at break times.
- Welfare check carried out on person behaving "strangely" by public toilets
- Educated group of people at Jubilee ponds with regard to dropping litter.
- Advice and contact details given to local shop owners after reports of person repeatedly acting in an inappropriate manner on the premises.
- Warden graffiti clean-up on Natts Lane and Station Road (8 separate sites).
- Graffiti in Lower Station Road Gardens reported to HDC.

Parking / Vehicles

- Complaint raised to Crawley Travel regarding antisocial parking on the High Street
- Joint patrol with HDC Parking Wardens at pick up time at Billingshurst Primary School
- Information given to HDC Parking Wardens for targeted patrols in "problematic" parking areas in Billingshurst (including High St).
- Potentially abandoned vehicle reported to Operation Crackdown (no MOT).
- Check carried out on vehicle being driven in Billingshurst, reported to Operation Crackdown for having no MOT.

- Welfare check on elderly member of community after concern raised by local person. Confirmed their welfare in place of safety, advised next of kin and scheme manager.
