



BILLINGSHURST PARISH WARDENS' REPORT

Criminal damage

- Home visit and advice / reassurance given to local resident after continued criminal damage sustained to vehicle by unknown party.
- Advice, reassurance and assistance with route planning and directing traffic given to local community after ram raid on Sainsbury's.

Anti-social behaviour

- Joint patrol with youth worker at Billingshurst station after reports of ASB at school closing time
- Attended to request of assistance from local business dealing with ASB behaviour from a person banned from the premises. Calmed situation then worked alongside PCSO to return them to a place of safety.
- Local business visited after report of historical incident of ASB, introduction made and advice given.
- Report of ASB in Jengers Mead reported, resulted in an increase of patrols in this area to monitor situation.
- Education and advice given to group of youths on the street re drug usage and criminality

Parking

- 7 x parking / dangerous driving reports made to operation crackdown
- Ad hoc Primary school parking initiatives carried out before / after school

Referrals

- 4 x police intel reports made regarding potential criminal activity linked to one address
- 1 x Farming Community Network introduction made for isolated elderly member of parish
- 1 x Adult Social Services referral made to parish resident presenting as requiring extra support.
