

BILLINGSHURST PARISH WARDENS' REPORT Sep 2018

Criminal damage

- Bench Station Road Gardens, liaised with Keith Brown & Police and carried out clean-up operation.
- Support given to WSFR and Police while attending fire at back of Jengers Mead.

Anti-social behaviour

- Youth's educated regarding use of Manor Fields area (scooter parked on grass).
- Intelligence report submitted to police after group of young adults suspected of smoking cannabis in Manor field area.
- Ongoing additional patrols at Railway Station at school closing time after reports of ASB from Weald students via the Weald.
- ASB prevention carried in conjunction with the Weald school to talk to a group of students regarding starting a warden run activity relevant to under 18's.
- Suspected drug driving (cannabis) intelligence given to police.
- Intelligence report completed for 3rd part information regarding drug dealing.
- Responded to ongoing ASB at Billingshurst train station, worked with weald pastoral team and Pullborough wardens to identify offenders from video footage taken.
- Two males seen trespassing at Brookers Road field. Both given advice ref drug use and littering and advised to move on from area which was complied with.
- Reports received from MOP about a large group of year 6 pupils from Billingshurst Primary
 causing a disturbance in the swimming pool and outside the venue. Visited venue and
 spoke to staff and will carry out additional patrols during aqua disco evenings on Fridays.

- Crest Nicholson also chased after agreement made to place signage to prevent littering and drinking on green space of Daux Farmhouse.
