## What is the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)?

Horsham District Council (HDC) collects CIL from the builders of all new properties.

HDC and West Sussex County Council (WSCC) retain the bulk of these funds, but 15% is passed directly to the Parish/Town Council where the development takes place. If the Parish has an agreed Neighbourhood Plan, the amount rises to 25%. In summary, Parish Councils are responsible for:-

- 1. Spending the CIL it receives (the neighbourhood portion) in line with the CIL regulations, to support the development of your area, or any part of that area by funding:
  - a) the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or
  - b) anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area.
- 2. Spending the CIL within 5 years of receipt.

It must produce and publish a report on any CIL received in a financial year by the December following that financial year.
