#### 29 MARCH 2023

The smoke detectors have now been fully installed in both the backstage and reception loft spaces, a reassurance all round that we now have all areas covered in cases of fire.

The process of moving away from Avalon for all our bookings is well underway having had our training with Rialtas earlier this month, we will be using the package exclusively from 1<sup>st</sup> April for all bookings as well as accounting.

The price increase has been met with a positive response from hirers. Catering charges will also rise alongside room rates from April 1<sup>st</sup>. A cup of tea/coffee and biscuits will be priced at 70p a cup instead of 50p and £1.20 instead of £1 for unlimited access, with the current rate of inflation, this small rise should see our costs are covered at the wholesalers.

Last summer we were contacted by a local resident concerned that we were over mowing our grass as it appeared brown and lifeless (something all our lawns experienced due to the dry summer) a suggestion had been made to leave a section for rewilding purposes, something I will investigate further. But a tidier option alongside rewilding would be to have 2 living wall panels on the patio to attract bees and butterflies, whilst taking away the bareness, I have attached a photo of what I am referencing. These can be made using pallet wood and sourcing plants from small garden centres so there's not too much of a cost factor involved, but I do think they could look very effective in that space.



The Warm Hub will come to an end on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March, it's been far more successful than any of us

believed it would be with a regular turnout every week. Having chatted to the Clerk, Councillor Day and the Neighbourhood Wardens, we all felt strongly that it should continue as a coffee morning as it's so clearly needed. All we are asking this time round is that refreshments are covered with a donation, which the attendees have been doing anyway. The wardens have mentioned that there is money in their budget for the nature of this booking and will look at covering the room hire if needs be.

We recently experienced some anti-social behaviour around the back of the centre when a local group of youths decided to play football, deliberately kicking the ball at our windows,

the warden's car, and CCTV camera, they also decided to try and access a neighbour's garden by scaling the fence. This all took place around 9pm when the building was being locked up for the night. Two complaints were made to reception the following morning, one having called the police but not met with much response. Having looked at CCTV with the Neighbourhood Wardens four of the youths have been identified and the wardens will speak to them when they see them. We have 2 spare channels for 2 additional cameras which I will ask Kestrel Alarms to quote for. Having a 365 view around the building will be key for us to keep on top of these incidents whilst having a bit of extra security in areas that are currently blind spots.

Lastly on a positive note, the Showcase took place last Saturday, which once again proved successful. The takings for catering sales amounted to £91.47, not bad considering the event ran for only 3 hours. I'm sure whilst writing this report, plans are afoot for next year's event!!
