Afternoon Greg,

Further to our recent email exchanges, I have set out below some initial information in relation to the proposed scheme ahead of the meeting next week, as promised.

The proposals are in the preliminary stages, however, please find attached a feasibility Proposed Site Plan to illustrate how the site could be laid out. The current layout shows the provision of a M&S foodstore with a gross floor area of 21,000 sq.ft and a net sales area of 15,000 sq.ft. The site will be accessed via the existing roundabout junction on Stane Street (A29) that serves the recently completed Lidl and trade park scheme and will be served by a total of 239 parking spaces, including disabled, family and EV charging bays, in line with M&S' operational requirements. A dedicated enclosed service yard will also be provided that will be designed to incorporate a turning circle that will enable a HGV to turn within the yard.


The proposed new M&S Foodhall will offer local customers a fresh offer with a brand-new look store designed with customers and local families at its heart, providing a convenient and high quality, modern format shopping destination. The proposed store will be almost entirely for the sale of convenience goods together with M&S' flowers and plants range, with a very small non-food range (e.g. cards and stationery). This would be supported by backstage floorspace (e.g. storage and administration). The store is likely to sell about 6-6,500 food lines in total, of which around 300 would be branded goods and the rest (about 95%) would be M&S' own brand. Local customers can expect to find an exciting range of fresh produce, flowers and fresh baked bread and pastries. M&S Food offers thousands of quality and great value products, from daily essentials like RSPCA Assured milk, to 100% responsible sourced fish and seafood and 100% British beef, chicken, duck and fresh pork from M&S Select Farmers.

M&S have a strong requirement for a store in Billinghurst, which would complement the existing stores in the surrounding area and will meet a gap in provision, and serve the needs of those customers living and working in or close to Billinghurst. The proposals represent substantial capital investment in the local area and will generate a large number of job opportunities for local people across a range of roles with opportunities for training and career progression, as well as an attractive package of employee benefits.

Sustainability will be at the heart of the scheme with M&S targeting becoming a net zero operation by 2040, with clear targets in place to reduce carbon emissions and waste; sustainable sourcing of materials and helping customers to recycle. The scheme will also deliver a 10% biodiversity net gain in line with current statutory requirements and a full suite of technical documents will accompany any future planning application addressing all relevant planning considerations.

I trust this initial information is helpful and we look forward to meeting you next week. It is likely to be Chris Smith (M&S), Nigel Desmond (Bride Hall Developments) and myself attending and obviously please let me know if you need any further information ahead of the meeting.

Thanks for your email and time on the phone.

We look forward to attending on the 3rd at 19:00 and will be more than happy to respond to any questions your members might have. We don't plan on making a presentation, however please let us know if you would like us to.

The core difference between the two applications is the reduced number of units, 117 down from 125. This results in subtle changes to the BNG (Biodiversity Net Gain) calculations, drainage figures etc however the number of plots is key difference, all other aspects of the site remain the same.

The reason for the second application is we have been approached by a specific user for that number of dwellings, albeit less than the site could deliver.

HIGH STREET AND EAST STREET TRAFFIC CALMING

REPORT BY CLERK TO THE COUNCIL

FOR DECISION

Following WSCC's rejection of the Parish Council's original Community Highways Scheme application for works to reduce through traffic and speeds and encourage sustainable transport in the central area, a further meeting was held with WSCC highways officers.


WSCC suggested we should instead submit a Community Highways Scheme (CHS) for each of the various elements of our proposals, but we declined, given that of all the CHS we had submitted since 2016 had been turned down bar one, for footbridge lighting.

It was suggested that a compromise approach would be for us to go through the package of works and try to marry up elements that we felt were the most important with the various S106 transport monies that were available for the parish and the sort of schemes they must be spent on.

As a result, WSCC released further S106 funds to facilitate Wilbar's reappointment to work with our Traffic Calming Working Party accordingly.

The Working Party has now met several times and agreed what they consider to be a modest and realistic package of works, attached. Earlier reservations of the F&GP Cttee have now been addressed.

The Council is invited to support the proposals and agree that they be submitted via Cty Cllr Mrs Amanda Jupp accordingly.



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
