

WE ARE VERY GRATEFUL FOR YOUR PREVIOUS GRANTS THAT HAVE BEEN USED TO HELP RECRUIT, TRAIN, SUPERVISE AND SUPPORT NEW VOLUNTEERS IN SUSSEX, SOME OF WHOM WOULD HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED TO WORK IN YOUR PARISH.

It also helps provide enhances training eg Rape, Hate Crime, Fraud, Domestic Violence for existing volunteers.

As you are probably aware, Victim Support is now a national charity divided into areas and <u>each area is responsible for its own fundraising budget and all funds raised</u> are allocated to individual <u>areas</u>.

Our AGM is held nationally.

In order to minimise accountancy costs, one set of accounts is now produced for all areas nationally and not individual areas, although our budgets and fundraising targets are based on individual areas. Supporting people in Sussex affected by crime

I am once again writing to ask, if BillingshurstParish Council would consider making a contribution towards our essential work in supporting people in Sussex who have been affected by crime. In Sussex we are still supporting a large number of Domestic abuse and on line Fraud cases.

Your previous grant was used to help with training of 12 new volunteers and enhanced training for new and existing volunteers.

The impact of crime

The impact of crime can be far reaching, not only to the victim but also their family, friends and the wider community. For example a Hate Crime can divide a local community and increase the fear of crime, making people feel unsafe where they live. The impact on a victim and their family can be huge affecting them financially, emotionally, physically and psychologically. Fraud crime by phone, email and dating sites is rising and causing vulnerable people to lose large sums of money and we are frequently supporting them.

Victim Support - What we do

- We offer a free and confidential service to victims of crime, their family, friends and anyone else affected.
- We support people from all communities, whatever crime they have suffered, whenever it happened, even when they have felt unable to report it to the police.
- We give information, emotional support and practical help for as long as it takes for the victim(s) to find the strength to move on with their lives.
- We operate the Young Witness Service in Sussex. Without this service many offenders would not be brought to justice because the young witnesses would not feel able to give evidence without our support.
- · We have a team specialising in Fraud, as this is an increasing crime

The Benefits for Local Communities

- Our diverse volunteer workforce, live and work locally.
- The high quality of our volunteers' training and the skills with which we equip them develops your communities and has a positive local impact beyond the criminal justice system.

- With their help victims of crime in Sussex are better able to recover and move on with their lives.
- Young witnesses can be more confident about giving evidence, helping to create a more effective justice system and a safer community and sense of well-being.
- We can help reduce the harm that crime does to people in Sussex.

What victims say about us

Here is just a small selection of the feedback we receive:

- "Victim Support genuinely care about you this makes a huge difference because you feel your issues are important and will be dealt with."
- "Victim Support helped me from the moment I reported the crime to the police until I said I didn't need them anymore. They were there for me emotionally, answering all my questions, explaining every step of the way to me."
- "This is the biggest fight I've had to face, but we will get through it. I didn't have support like this when it happened to me when I was younger - I had no one to believe me. But Victim Support sticks by you - I thank them from the bottom of my heart."
- "Thank you to your Young Witness Service team for looking after me, without which a very stressful time would have been unbearable."
- "I had not received information before going to court and went in 'blind'. On the day, the Young Witness Service did an excellent job of making me feel prepared and more at ease about giving evidence. Thank you."

How your donation could be spent

Every contribution to the work that we do can make a big difference. For example:

- £250 could help us to support 10 young victims of bullying and harassment.

Hi Greg, following on from the meeting with the PC on the 7th May I have made some minor adjustments to the Option C 01 plan as follows,

High St between West St and East St - Extend the proposed 20mph limit south of the entrance to Jubilee Court. As discussed the reduction of a speed limit is reliant on the average speed of vehicles being below the implementation threshold which for a 20mph limit is average speeds to be below 26mph. Where existing speeds are higher measures would be required to achieve that speed threshold which in this case would be engineering such as speed humps etc. As suggested in the meeting I have shown a priority system and build-out but I think this needs a bit more thought. Build-outs have limited success where opposing flows are not equal or are low. In such circumstances where traffic does not have to give way as there are no vehicles approaching from the opposite direction the build-out has little effect on speeds.

Thank you for the photos of the signs. The one by Station Rd and further up on the approach to East St have some legitimacy as once a driver is in Billingshurst how do they get out. The existing signs on the A29 and A272 approaches don't positively sign to the industrial areas off Station Road so drivers have to work it out for themselves. Therefore to try and positively sign the industrial areas would likely place the burden on West St or Stane St no doubt with some local opposition.

I would suggest that the attached plans and report would be a good starting point for the C Cllr to discuss with Michelle Hume at WSCC. I could possibly attend that meeting if needed but I suggest that Michelle will delegate down any technical discussions so I wouldn't have much input.

I think we have satisfied the deliverables in the Project Scope so if you agree we will submit our invoice.



In recent summers the Neighbourhood Wardens (NW) have organised sports taser sessions, with limited success. Having noticed a Family Fun Day organised by NW in Storrington, the Parish Council suggested to the wardens that they might do something similar in Billingshurst.

To this end the NW will be holding a Family Fun Day at Jubilee Fields on Sat 4 August Noon-4pm, courtesy of the BSRA. The Parish Council has been supporting the NW in the organising of this. The target is children and young people with an emphasis on things the visitors can do. To date a climbing wall has been booked, along with bushcraft demonstrations. Some funfair rides are also attending. Refreshments incl, a BBQ will be served from the pavilion which will be open for a cricket match. The Parish Council itself hopes that the occasion will be an ideal opportunity to *officially open* the new skatepark and some proficient BMXers etc are being sought to come along and *wow* the crowds!

The NWs are drawing down the residue (£713.32) of a grant secured from the Sussex PCC some years ago held by the Council for the sports taster sessions and have secured a donation of £500 from Billingshurst Lions who also hope to be able to help on the day.

I have identified a further Earmarked Reserve (EMR) that could be put to the event. Prior to my arrival, there has been a reserve called Youth Projects that we believe emanated from a third party, but no one can recall its source.
