CCTV

REPORT BY CLERK

FOR INFORMATION

The Council has been progressing the provision of public realm CCTV.

Following approval of a specification, the Council appointed a contractor last Spring.

Since then I have been seeking permissions from third parties for consent to attach equipment to their properties. The attached table show the current status relating to each camera site.

In some instances, for example where the Parish Council is the landowner, few consents are required.

Some landowners have been very cooperative and agreements reached easily. Some initially consented but then changed their mind.

Two sites have encountered particular problems:

- a. At Library Car Park, HDC has declined the use of a lighting column due to its height and robustness to carry additional equipment. I have enquired if we can replace the column but no answer has been forthcoming. This in itself has held us up gaining permissions from WSCC's streetlighting contractor (enerveo) as I had hoped to submit one bulk application for all columns upon which we wished to install kit. In this instance the hold-up is created as the original design involved installing relays on several High Street columns in order to carry the signal from that particular camera back to the Billingshurst Centre. The contractor is now looking at transmission alternatives in this location that do not require relays.
- b. At the Jubilee Skate Park, the cost to bury a cable from the clubhouse is £32,000 and there is no low voltage supply on the adjoining A29. Thus I am encouraging the contractor to consider alternatives including solar and battery, but the load required is significant as not only is night vision required but it then has to transmit the signal onwards.

I am meeting the contractor in the New Year on site to look at some of the difficult sites, but we have agreed that where permissions are now in place, work can commence.

HIGH STREET AND EAST STREET TRAFFIC CALMING

REPORT BY CLERK TO THE COUNCIL

FOR INFORMATION

Having submitted several schemes in recent years for comprehensive traffic calming schemes in High Stret and East Street, all to no avail, WSCC suggested that more modest schemes might be more successful.

As a result, the Council submitted an application to reduce the speed limit to 20mph in High Street from Hilland Roundabout to West Street.

The proposal has received detailed assessment and was awaiting moderation in October. I was advised last week that the results of the moderation have yet to be released. I hope to be able to report further at the meeting.

The tandem scheme, for which we now have a detailed specification, involves so-called gateway-features and speed indicator devices. This can be implemented once any change to the speed limit in High Street is confirmed.

The Council is invited to note this report.
